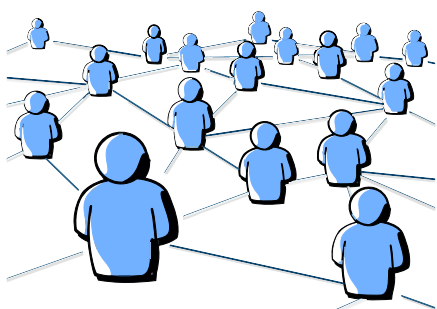


KEEP INFORMATION PRIVATE

Never share personal information publicly online.
Your name, address, telephone number

FILTER THEIR CURIOSITY

Adjust settings on Ipads, Apps and talk to your Broadband provider about family safe settings.
Privacy settings on social networks are very important

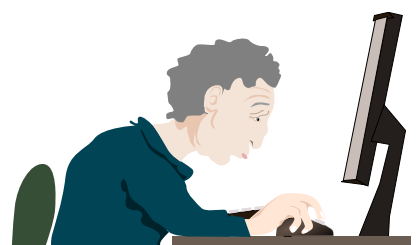


THINK BEFORE YOU POST

Teach your child to think about what they post. Long after a delete button has been pressed, a photo or personal details could have been shared with many hundreds of people

NEVER AGREE TO MEET ANYONE ONLINE

Teach your child to never take invites from strangers or agree to meet anyone who has contacted them online.
If someone wants to meet them without their parent present this is a red flag and parents should be informed immediately.



INFORM THEM HOW PREDATORS OPERATE

It is ok to teach your child about how dangerous individuals will seek them out and use flattery to isolate them from friends and family. How quickly this can happen and if they are ever worried it is usually a good sign that this is not a healthy or safe interaction. Use social stories for young people on the spectrum.
